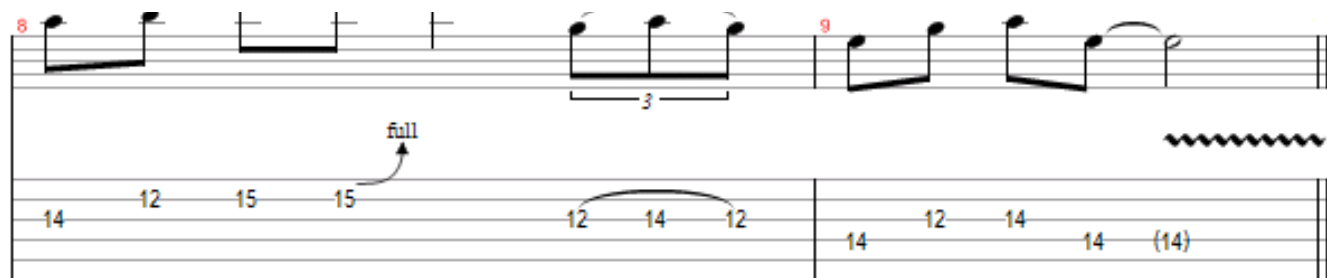


Guitar Tricks 109: Playing Melodic Phrases
